SLTs provide services that focus on verbal and non-verbal communication development as well as the oral motor skills required for drinking and

They provide support in the following areas:

- Language understanding and use
- Social communication
- Intelligibility of speech
- Facial expression (using it and understanding expressions)
- Body language and gestures
- Alternative or augmentative communication (AAC)
- Fluency
- Pre-literacy skills
- Swallowing and feeding issues

Audiologist

Audiologists provide services that focus on hearing and listening.

They provide support in the following areas:

- The identification of hearing loss
- Fitting of hearing aids
- Development of a programme and training on the maintenance of the hearing aid
- Developing communication with hearing and listening as a focus
- Diagnosing and providing therapy for central processing disorders
- Providing aural rehabilitation for paediatric patients who has cochlear implants or hearing aids

What to look out for and how to help your child develop.

Age	Area of Development	Milestones
0-6 Months	Speech, Language and Feeding:	 Recognises voice Coos, squeals, gurgles Pays attention to mother's face and lips Able to tolerate breastmilk or formula
	Hearing:	Attends to soundsLocates the source of a sound.
7-12 Months	Speech, Language and Feeding:	 Responds to his/her own name Recognises simple words Imitates sounds/words Self-feeding with finger
	Hearing:	Responds to music with body motion
13-18 Months	Speech, Language and Feeding:	 Uses 5-7 words constantly Responds to a question Starts using a spoon Eats regular food
	Hearing:	Hearing and vision are fully developed
19-24 Months	Speech, Language and Feeding	 Combines 2-3 words Understands most things said to them Expressive (what they say) vocabulary of more or less 50 words Holds cup independently
2-3 Years	Speech, Language and Feeding	 Uses 3-words sentences Understand most question forms Stabs food with fork

*Untreated disabilities

Can lead to:

- Delayed language development
- Hearing loss
- Recurrent ear infections
- Learning difficulties
- Sensory processing difficulties
- Visual impairment
- Cerebral palsy
- Seizure disorder/epilepsy
- ADHD (Attention deficit and hyperactivity disorder)
- Emotional difficulties (shyness, social anxiety)



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
